Each spring the Iowa 4-H Foundation, in partnership with Pioneer Hi-Bred, provides 4-H clubs with "seed" money to develop a service project in their community, and every fall we are amazed to see how some of these projects grew far beyond expectations.



One such example comes from Black Hawk County where the Lincoln Friendly Links 4-H Club embarked on a special project to help children who are removed from their home and parents by child welfare services.

Max Exner Inducted into National 4-H Hall of Fame

Iowa 4-H music specialist Max Exner was inducted posthumously along with 19 other 2006 honorees into the National 4-H Hall of Fame in recent ceremonies in Chevy Chase, Md. Exner is the eighth Iowan to be inducted into the National 4-H Hall of Fame, along with two others with Iowa State University connections.

Exner worked with the Iowa State University Extension as state music specialist from 1947 until 1980. In this role, he conducted a statewide leadership training program for community, church and youth leaders that included singing,

As we approach the holiday season it is nice to look back with thanks and celebrate what we have accomplished in the past year. Together we have accomplished a lot!

Did you know 4-H is the largest out-of-school youth program in Iowa – reaching fully one-quarter of our young people? That is an incredible success!

Iowa 4-H youth programs also included 12,000 volunteer leaders who helped young people feel a sense of belonging, experience their independence, learn skills to the point of mastery, and become contributing members of society.

More than 7,000 young people showed their projects at the 2006 Iowa State Fair, parading their champion animals, displaying blue ribbon breads, and sharing the fun with close to a quarter million fair goers.

The Iowa 4-H Center welcomed more than 6,000 youth and adults at camp last year – more than the Boy Scouts across the river. This past September was one of our busiest months, with over one thousand campers enjoying the woods, fields, and streams near Madrid!

The Iowa 4-H Foundation awarded more than 100 scholarships, helping young

people live their dreams of going to college and preparing for future careers.

4-H has made a positive difference for many people – successfully changing lives one young person at a time.

As I've traveled across Iowa, I've met 4-H friends like the farmer who has grown his business with the skills learned from his 4-H record book. I've shared a meal with a couple who met at the 4-H food booth (when she spilled his drink), and learned how 4-H has been a constant companion for their family through 30 (or was that 40) years of marriage.

I've visited with the veterinarian who is researching ways to protect us from avian flu using the animal husbandry skills she learned in her 4-H club, and I've talked with the marketing executive who took his first picture with a 4-H camera and won that blue ribbon at the county fair.

I've been inspired by the 4-H alum that I hear reading the market news on the radio every day – the same young man who helps lead Iowa's Operation Military Kids program, working with 4-H youth whose parents are deployed in Iraq or Afghanistan – and by the young law student, named one of the "Top 10 Women to Watch"

by a national magazine, who aspires to be Iowa's first woman governor.

All of these people shared with me that their success goes back to their time in 4-H. It goes back to their 4-H friends, leaders, and parents. And it goes back to **you**, our donors, for supporting this amazingly successful program.

Without you, we would not have the project awards or scholarships for our outstanding young people. We would not have the beautiful new bathrooms at the 4-H camp or the amazing facilities here at the Extension 4-H Youth Building. Without you, we would not have had one of the best years in the Foundation's history, and we definitely would not have the thousands of young people living 4-H's motto to "Make the Best Better" for all of us here in Iowa.

At this time of year it is nice to say "**thank you**" for all of your support of 4-H. Together, I know we can look forward to another successful year.

Waterloo 4-H Youth Care For Children

4-H Club Plants the Seed, Involves Community to Address a Need

for these children, many of whom are removed during drug busts or abuse/neglect situations with nothing but the clothes on their back.

The club started out making a fleece blanket for every child to give them a little comfort and security during a difficult time.

Combining their own money with the money they received from the Pioneer Grant, members worked on four different days to make 64 blankets!

As the club learned more about the needs of the children they were helping, the kits expanded to include a stuffed animal and personal toiletry items.



The club project was featured in the Waterloo Courier which sparked the interest of the Pathways Drug Free Coalition. The Coalition joined the project by supplying more materials and tote bags for the kits.

In October, the Friendly Links participated in a town hall meeting that addressed the issue of children living with parents and adults who have methamphetamine and other drug addictions. The public was informed of the care kit project and invited to bring supplies for making new kits.

Soon thereafter, two school service classrooms joined in, adding 60 more youth to the project. They took to the task of writing letters to dentist

offices and hotels, asking for donations of toothbrushes and shampoo. School PSA groups also helped by securing donations from students and teachers.

New community partners jumped on the bandwagon by providing the funds to purchase more kit materials which expanded again to include coloring books and crayons.

This collaborative effort continues to draw media attention in the Waterloo area. The Friendly Links describe it as “an overwhelming but extremely rewarding project.” They are very thankful for the “seed” that has grown to help so many children in their community.

music appreciation and folk dancing. He directed statewide festivals of Iowa's County Women's Choruses and led music and dramatic productions for several youth organizations and camps.

Throughout his career, Exner also directed the State 4-H Chorus at the annual Iowa 4-H state conferences.

His 4-H work was not confined to Iowa. Exner arranged eight popular 4-H songs recorded on the album, “Songs of the 4-H Clover,” with The Chamber Singers of Iowa State in 1963. This album, along with a companion song book edited by Exner, was distributed nationwide by the National 4-H Supply Service. In the preface, he urged singers,

“Sing the 4-H songs! Sing them with a lift and a lilt. There is gloom enough in the world! Sing the 4-H songs!”

Exner was not only an arranger and conductor, but an accomplished composer as well. Among his works were two popular 4-H songs, “I Have Just One” and “There Is a First Time for Everything.” His anthem, “I Have a Dream,” was approved by the Martin Luther King, Jr. Foundation and his folk songs appeared in songbooks published throughout his career.

Exner was active in the city of Ames, Iowa, participating in choral festivals, the Heartland Senior Variety Show and leading the Ames International Folk Dancers. He was inducted into the Iowa 4-H Hall of Fame in 2003.

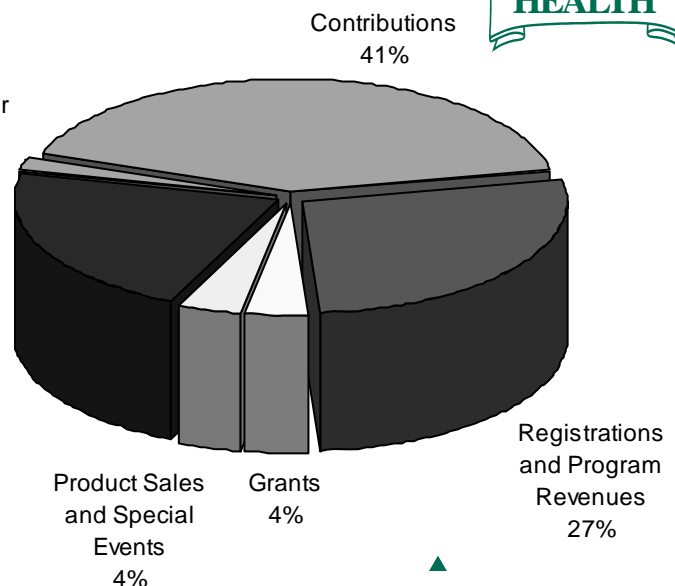
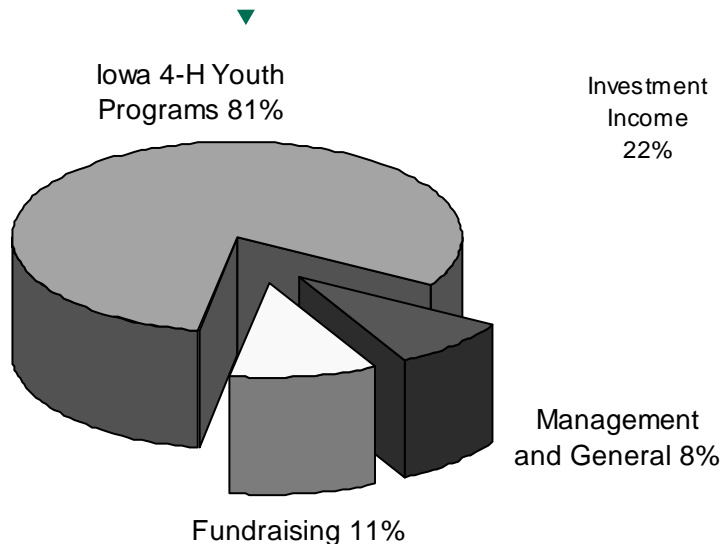
